## **Learning Outcomes**

- (1) To enhance students' overall **interest** in and **awareness** of environmental conservation, especially those about **wetlands**
- (2) To enable students to **connect** what they learn from the environmental courses to the real-life situation
- (3) To remind students of their **roles** in protecting our environment
- (4) To provide students with chances in developing skills of **communication, presentation, organization, problem solving, time management, self learning, and team working**
- (5) To equip students with **work experience** in conservation-related areas

## **Target Students (Quota: 15)**

- **BSc in Biological Sciences** (LIFS 2011: Major Elective)
- **BSc in Biochemistry and Cell Biology / BSc in Biotechnology** (Free Elective)

- **BSc in Environmental Science** (Free Elective)

Students are expected to be able to communicate effectively in **Cantonese** (since the training sessions and most of the on-site service will be conducted in Cantonese).

## **Course Description**

### **(1) Content**

- a. **Training** as ecotour guide and exhibition interpreter
- b. **On-site service** as ecotour guide and exhibition interpreter

### **(2) Schedule: 31 December 2016 - 30 April 2017**

- a. **Training:** 31 Dec 2016, 7 & 14 Jan 2017  
(3 full days, 09:30 – 17:00; full attendance is required)
- b. **On-site Service:** After training to 30 Apr 2017

### **(3) Requirement of On-site Service: 35 hours minimum**

- a. Service arrangement
  - Full day (7 hours' service, 09:30-17:00)
  - Half day (3 hours' service, 09:30-12:30 or 13:30-16:30)
- b. Service schedule is subject to the arrangement between students and HKWP
